1. The Tournament will be conducted according to the tournament regulations of BADMINTONScotland, including the prohibition of doping for which tests may be carried out.
2. The Tournament Age Group events shall be restricted to players who were born as follows:
U13 – Born in 2007 or later
U15 – Born in 2005 or later
U17 – Born in 2003 or later
U19 – Born in 2001 or later
Player's first right of entry is to their own age group. They may however enter an older age group subject to the right of refusal from the Tournament Committee.
3. A separate entry form must be used by each competitor and each competitor may play in a maximum of 3 events – one singles, one doubles and one mixed.
No pair shall be accepted for a doubles event unless entry forms have been received from both players.
Players indicating "partner required" will be paired wherever possible. Where there is no available partner, entry fee refunds will be given on the day.

5. Entries sent without the appropriate entry fees are unlikely to be accepted.
Late entries may only be accepted at discretion of Tournament Organiser.
6. The tournament committee reserve the right, if necessary, to:
 - Refuse to accept an entry without giving their reasons for doing so
 - Limit the number of entries in Singles events
7. Any unannounced withdrawals will be notified to BADMINTONScotland and monitored by the Events Committee.

8. Provided court time permits, Consolation Events will be run for first match losers in each event [no Consolation if the event is played in pools due to small entry size].
9. Matches will be best of 3 games to 21 points with setting.
Where there is a Consolation Event, matches will be 1 game to 21 points with setting.
(Referee has discretion to change scoring format in event of unforeseen circumstances)
10. Coaching is permitted.
11. Ashaway feather shuttlecocks will be used in all events.
12. Players shall report to the Committee Table on arrival on both dates and must subsequently report to the hall table when called.
Players should be in attendance and ready to play at least 20mins prior to first scheduled match.
Players absent when called on to play may be scratched.
13. Play will be continuous from 9:15am on Sat 19th Jan commencing with Singles events.
Saturday main draw events will be played up to and including Quarter-Finals.
Consolation Events will be played to completion on same day.
Mixed Doubles will take place on Sun 20th Jan commencing at 9:15am, followed by all Main Draw events Semi-Finals.
Finals should commence around 1:30pm on Sun 20th Jan.
Prizegiving ceremony will take place after the last Final is completed.
Please note that scheduling is subject to alteration depending on size of entry.
14. Players must inform the Referee on arrival if they do not wish to be included in any official photographs that may be taken by tournament organisers.
15. Clothing and advertising must conform to the Badminton World Federation (BWF) Regulations.
16. The BADMINTONScotland Parental Code of Conduct must be adhered to.

Parental Code of Conduct for Tournaments

Any player entered in a tournament (domestic or otherwise) is expected to show a responsible attitude in both performance and appearance: this includes arriving in a fit state to participate and behaving appropriately both during and between matches.

Parents/guardians play a vital role in the development of the player. We ask that you adhere to this Parental Code of Conduct.

All parents/guardians are asked to adhere to the undernoted:

1. to ensure, whenever possible, that your child arrives at all tournaments timeously (and at least 20 minutes before scheduled tournament matches);
2. to show respect to fellow parents/guardians; and to demonstrate appropriate social behaviour;
3. never to speak negatively to, or about, other players, in front of your own child or anyone else;
4. to show respect to all coaches and tournament volunteers;
5. to show respect to the decisions of the court officials;
6. to note that you may watch matches, but are asked not to communicate with your child during such matches, except where coaching is allowed at breaks;
7. to ensure your child is well behaved on and off court;
8. to treat all other players and parents/guardians with respect: without your children's opponents, there would be no matches!;
9. to ensure that your child is collected safely at the end of tournaments, or that they have permission to travel home by other means.

Finally, please note that any instances of poor conduct on the part of any parent/guardian, or breaches of this Code, may result in action being taken against the parent/guardian in question in the form of a ban from attending future tournaments, for a determined period of time.
